

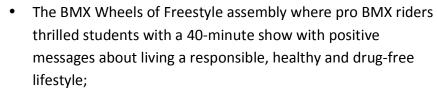
Port View Pulse
